Review: What is the Bible?

- A Library, not a Book
- The story of a God who loves us enough to create us, walk with us, rescue us, sustain us and give us eternal life.
- 2 Main Sections: Old Testament (pre-Jesus) and New Testament (Jesus & Early Church)

Old Testament

- 39 Books, written between 1200-300BC
- 5 Sections:
 - Pentateuch (Books of Moses) 5 books
 - History 12 books
 - Poetry & Wisdom Literature 5 books
 - Major Prophets 5 books
 - Minor Prophets 12 books

New Testament

- Jesus and after
- 27 Books, written between 50-100AD
 - 3 Sections:
 - Gospels & Acts (5 books)
 - Letters(Epistles) (21)
 - Revelation (1)

Understanding the Bible

- The Bible has been translated and retranslated so many times that it's been corrupted.
- Christians throughout the centuries have edited the Bible to make it fit with their beliefs.
- The Bible is so old that is doesn't have any relevance for us today.
- The Bible is so full of contradictions that we can't trust it.

- The Bible talks about miracles, and since we know that miracles can't happen, it can't be true.
- The Bible is just like any other religious book (Qur'an, Book of Mormon) - a good story, maybe, but not true.
- A lot of books were left out of the Bible because they didn't fit the agenda of the people who put it together.
- The authors of the Bible made it all up to suit their own desires.

- Were they telling the truth?

Is what we have today what the original authors originally wrote down?

- Determined by 2 more questions:
 - How many manuscript copies do we have?
 - How close (in years) are the copies we have to the original date of writing?
