Will the new Rector be here by October? Well, maybe yes..... or maybe no. Given this uncertainty, Laura asked if your RTP(s) would come back in October for a brief continuation of our terms. With a summer at the beach stretching out before me, I said, "Sure, if you need me." I don't know if Tim has been corralled yet. By the way, Laura Warner deserves your heartfelt thanks for her commitment as Senior Warden to leading this parish. She has great instincts regarding what is important in church life; she gets things done faithfully and well; she is a natural leader.

Thank you, again, for embracing Tim and me. We still have work to do this month and then it will be off with us. One can still pray during summer vacation so I will keep you in my prayers knowing that a great new chapter in your life together is nigh.



## **MAY OUTREACH PROJECT: IN JACOB'S SHOES**

The Jacob Zweig Foundation was formed in honor of the life of Jacob Zweig who was tragically killed at the age of seventeen. Jacob touched and inspired many people, volunteering as a Soccer Buddy for children with special needs and making friends across the globe. It was clear early on that Jacob had a natural gift for making everyone, regardless of ability, feel accepted, loved and part of a group.

To honor Jacob's legacy, his family and friends wanted to support local organizations and continue Jacob's way of treating others with dignity and inclusion. Formed in 2009, the Foundation, known as In Jacob's Shoes, honors the love and encouragement Jacob gave to all who knew him and will strive to continue Jacob's way of making a difference in the lives of others. In Jacob's Shoes, is a 501(c)(3) charity which gives children in need the opportunity to walk with pride, and go to school or play sports with dignity. In Jacob's Shoes provides new and gently used shoes to local children in need.

Sadly, there are children in South Florida living in poverty who have truancy issues or are teased because their shoes are old, dirty or torn. There are children in our schools who are wearing shoes that do not fit, or have soles that are detached or missing. Some are removed from their homes because of abuse or neglect and are then taken to a shelter to be "processed," with little clothing and few personal belongings. Many will not get a new pair of shoes for back-to-school or will not be able to play sports because they do not have the right pair of shoes. It is difficult to believe that these tragic scenarios exist today, but for the nearly 20% of children in South Florida who live in poverty and the thousands more who live in foster care, some of these stories are only too familiar.

Since 2009, In Jacob's Shoes has been addressing these issues and has provided **over 125,000 pairs** of new and refurbished shoes for children in need living in Broward, Palm Beach and Miami-Dade Counties. These children live in poverty, are homeless, or live in shelters. Some live in foster care or have "aged-out" of foster care. All are in need.

They purchase thousands of pairs of new shoes each year and also receive in-kind donations of new and gently worn shoes from the community, businesses, schools and volunteers. Volunteers assist in collecting, sorting, cleaning and restoring the gently worn shoes to pristine condition.

#### VESTRY BUILDINGS AND GROUNDS REPORT

Greetings from the Vestry - **Building and Grounds**. The Building and Grounds ministry is in the process of updating the irrigation system and researching some new landscape options for the outside of the church. Going into summer is a very appropriate time to go through an irrigation system and make sure it is running well. Things dry out very quickly this time of year and the rainy season hasn't quite started yet. The most influential thing one can do for landscaping is making sure plants are properly hydrated. If we are going to think about adding new landscaping, we need to make sure we can properly water it.

Once the irrigation gets updated, we will manage the existing landscape by providing proper fertility and maintenance, and God willing, we may start to improve the landscaping around the property by maintaining existing and adding and replacing some of the old plants. Many of the plants around the property are very old and have become leggy and tired plants that need replacing. The good news is we have done soil tests and the soil at Holy Trinity is very good. Spring is a great time to improve landscaping, hopefully we will start to see results in the weeks to come.

#### VITA NOVA OUTREACH PROJECT

During the month of March, our Outreach project was to collect sheets, pillowcases, blankets, comforters, brand-new vacuums and cleaning products. Initially we received this thank you from the organization:

We are overwhelmed with joy over here at Vita Nova after seeing the donations arrive today. Thank you and the congregation for choosing our mission for assistance for the month of March. We will be sure to be in touch with you about the impact you have made for so many homeless youth in our county.

Later, as promised, the following letter was sent to us by Jeff DeMario, the Chief Executive Officer of the organization describing the impact our donations had.

#### Dear Holy Trinity,

This week a young man, John (not his real name) came to us, homeless and needing help with too many things to mention.

I noticed him on Monday then Tuesday, then Wednesday and by Thursday I asked him to join a conversation we have with all of our youth who drop in on that particular day. The point of the meeting is to just hear what is on their minds. He was quiet the entire time.

When he finally spoke he described the conditions where he was staying in a shelter in West Palm Beach. He said there were no pillows, sheets, or blankets to sleep on at the shelter. He stated how much he missed those things by being homeless and how they interrupt his ability to sleep and feel productive the next day.

I showed him the donations Holy Trinity gave us and asked if he would like a set for his bed at the shelter. He said, "no," unless the others living there could have some too.

I thought to myself, this is amazing. Here is this youth with nothing and with a chance to better himself and he was looking out for others. I also thought, shame on me for not offering first.

We supplied 10 youth at the shelter with pillows, sheets, blankets and such. John came into Vita Nova on Friday talking about how the other youth were shocked to have these donations. He said they spoke as if a miracle happened. John, looking refreshed, asked how he could help us that day. Before I could answer he noticed the paint needed to be touched up and began to freshen up the entire place.

I was not allowed to take a picture at the shelter so all I can give you and the congregation is a 1000 words of gratitude. You really made a difference for these youth, and along the way reminded me of two very valuable lessons.
